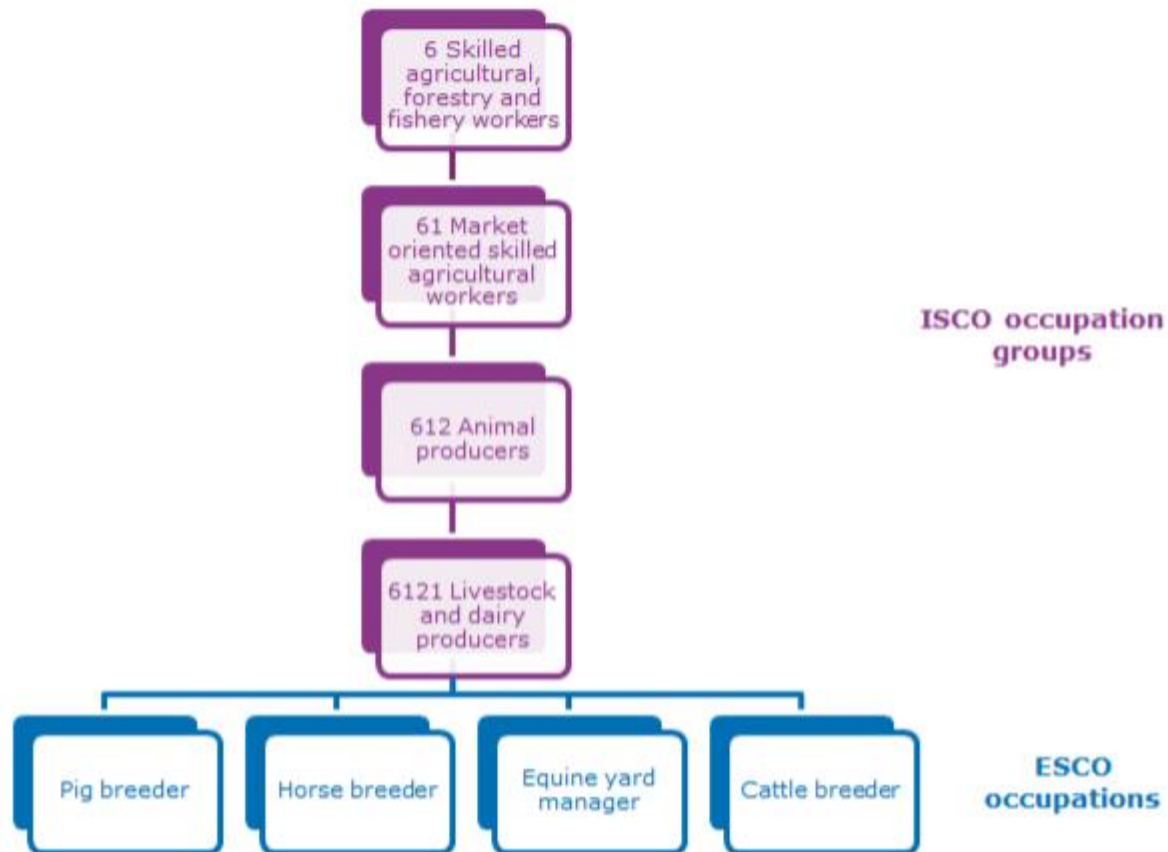

 - *Quality of input text*

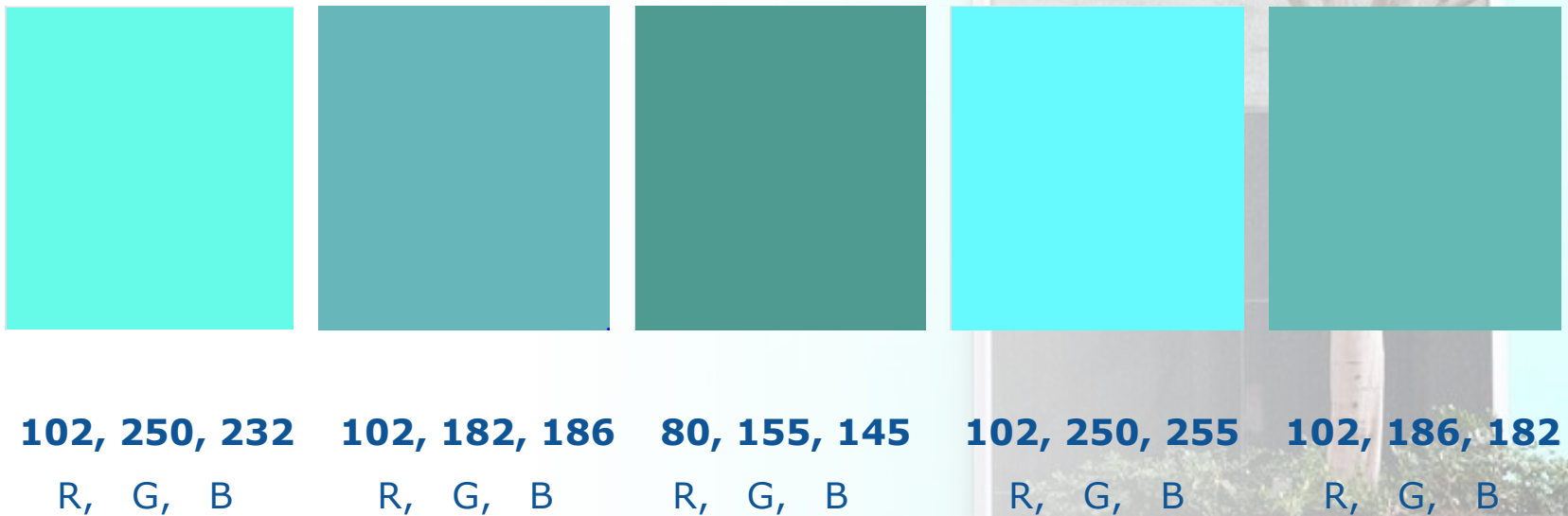

- ➡ ... Jobareas? Growthpaths? Language adapted to target groups?
- ➡ Make the AI black box 'decisions' transparent

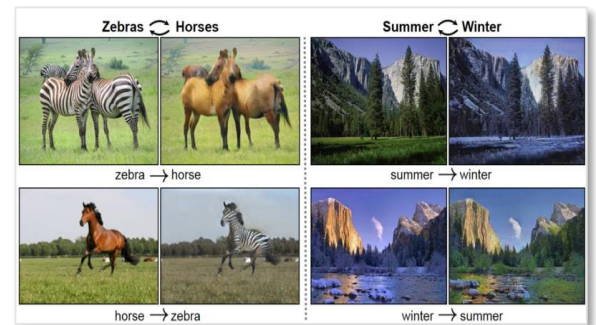

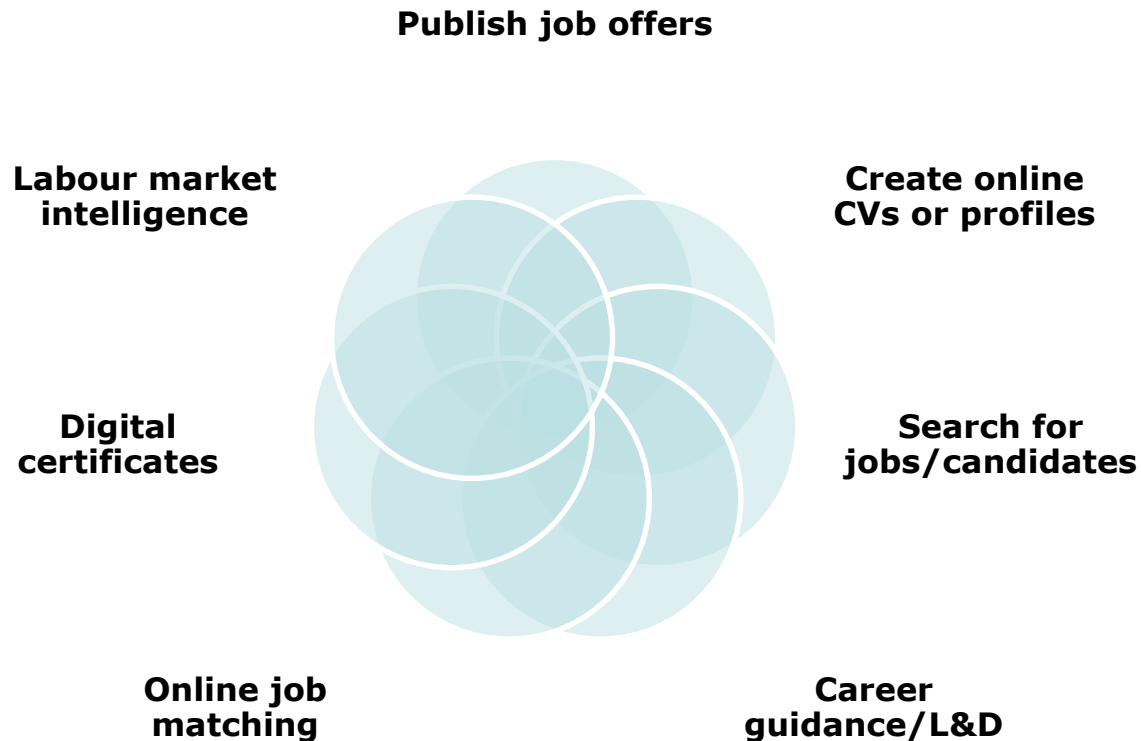
- ➡ Solve inconsistencies (doubles, similarities, etc.)

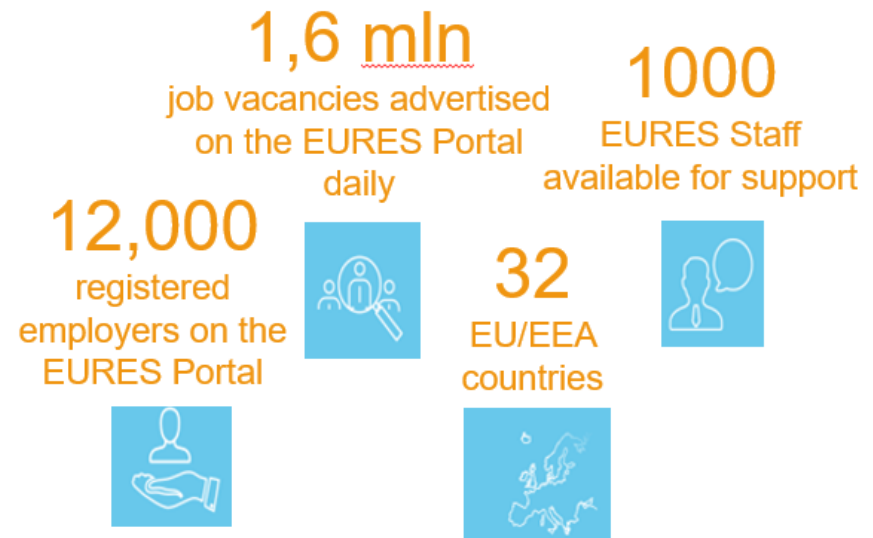

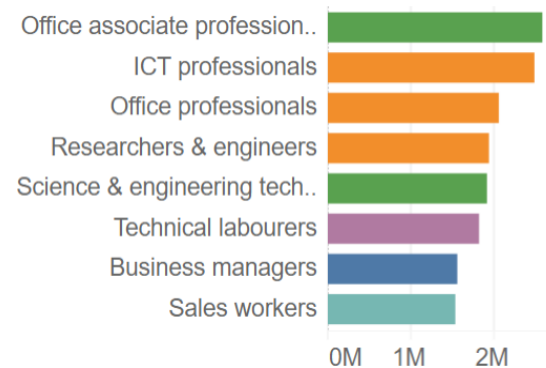
